Meeting of June 14, 2022

The six hundred fifty-fifth meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Tuesday, June 14, 2022 via Zoom. The meeting was called to order by Chair Gardyn at 6:00 p.m. followed by a salute to the flag.

#### 3. Trustee Durso introduced the following resolution:

**Be It Resolved,** upon the recommendation of the Nassau Community College Board of Trustees Finance and Capital Committee the Nassau Community College Board of Trustees authorizes the increase in the hourly rate of pay for Nassau Community College student aides and Federal Work Study employees to \$14.00 effective December 31, 2020 and \$15.00 effective December 31, 2021 for on- and off-campus employment.

Chair Gardyn requested a motion to consider this item. Trustee Jackson moved the motion; seconded by Trustee Weiss. Motion carried 9-0.

Vice Chair Weiss made a motion under Article VIII section C(6) of the Rules of Procedure to allow for the consideration of an item that does not appear on the Calendar. Trustee Durso seconded the motion. Motion carried 9-0.

#### 4. Trustee Weiss introduced the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that there is hereby established the NCC Presidential Search Committee, with a membership of 15 as follows: Trustee Wanda Jackson, Co-Chair; Trustee Kathy Weiss, Co-Chair; Trustee Siberón, and Trustee Aniruddh Patel in the capacity as Student Trustee, Stuart Kaplan, as designee of the Academic Department Chairs; Elizabeth Hynes-Musnisky as designee of the Academic Senate; Stefan Krompier, as designee of the Adjunct Faculty Association (AFA); Christopher Enright, as designee of the Civil Service Employees Association (CSEA, College employee): Craig Wright, as designee of the Managerial Confidential Staff; Kevin Fox, as designee of the Nassau Community College Administrators Association (NCCAA); Faren Siminoff, as designee of the Nassau Community College Federation of Teachers (NCCFT); Sara Morrison, as designee of the Nassau Community College Alumni Association; Ann Weber Hughes, as designee of the Nassau Community College Foundation; Demetrius Watkins, as designee of FSA/SGA; and Miguel Alonso, as designee of the Campus Representative/HSI; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the mission of this committee shall be to assist the Board in fulfilling its duty to select a president, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that those appointed to this committee are considered volunteers, and shall accept their position after agreeing that they are serving voluntarily.

Vice Chair Weiss requested a motion to consider this item. Trustee Gardyn moved the motion; seconded by Trustee Weiss. Motion carried 9-0.

Dr. Conzatti reported on the following items:

The College submitted a \$2.9 million HIS Grant, the grant will provide funding for three major initiatives: upgrading of Banner, implementation of SUNY Guided Pathways and Retention and completion for underserved students with a focus on our Hispanic student population.

She congratulated Trustee Kathy Weiss, Dr. David Follick, and Dr. Charmian Smith on the acceptance of a proposal they submitted to American Community College Trustees (ACCT). They will be making a presentation on our 4-year housing and accommodation program, Nassau-Adelphi Gateway, at the October 2022 ACCT Leadership Congress in New York City.

#### **Speakers**

Stefan Krompier, AFA President, on behalf of his group thanked Donna Haugen for her excellent job as Officer-in-Charge and praised the Board on the appointment of Maria Conzatti as Interim President. During her long tenure as a Vice President, she demonstrated that she is a great manager with the ability to resolve issues. The AFA is excited with the team she is assembling, particularly in the Office of Academic Affairs, which he feels will give the College its best chance to flourish again, especially in the areas of recruitment and retention. He and the AFA are eager and committed to work with Dr. Conzatti and her team, and from past experience are confident that the College will be able to work through our issues collegially and professional even when inevitable differences of opinion arise. He is hopeful for the future.

Elizabeth Hynes-Musnisky, Academic Senate Chair, reiterated her comments from last month that she and the Academic Senate are excited and committed to work with the Board and Dr. Conzatti to restore the reputation of the College. She addressed new Trustees Rosenberg and Stris, offering essential highlights of shared governance: 1) it is synonymous with participatory governance and is a key element in higher ed and in democracy; 2) it means that all constituents cooperate and collaborate in the decision-making process; and 3) in this process, all interested persons have access to all relevant information and have the opportunity to research and to debate the issues and to provide input into decisions that impact the College.

Chair Gardyn announced the next Capital and Finance BOT Committee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 13, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. followed by the Full Board meeting. The Board will open the public session between 6:15 and 6:30 p.m. and resume the public session approximately 7:30 p.m.

Chair Gardyn requested a motion to adjourn the meeting. Trustee Rosenberg moved the motion; seconded by Trustee Weiss. Motion carried 9-0.
