

## COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH WORKER

Train to Become a  
Community Mental Health Worker  
in Just 5 Months!



Community Mental Health Worker (CMHW) Program is a multi-faceted program, that is based on the wellness and recovery model in mental health. The curriculum is designed to train a diverse group of front-line health workers to provide culturally responsive mental health and recovery services in the community. It is comprised of courses that promote the development of skills needed to become gainfully employed as a mental health worker and enhance the knowledge base of those already employed. As part of your education, you will complete a field internship with local agencies and institutions, serving consumers of mental health services and family members. The CMHW will provide community-based management for people who have serious, long-standing, mental health difficulties. CMHWs may work with targeted client populations, based on the employee's skills and experience. Students may apply for the Scholarships to help with tuition, supplies, transportation, and child care.

The CMHW Program prepares graduates to help other as they face moments of difficulty and challenge, which may lead to stress and affect one's mental wellness and quality of life. If you are interested in helping people or learning about a field of study that will prepare you for entry-level positions in behavioral and mental health, the Community Mental Health Certificate Program is the place for you.

- Must be Unemployed or Underemployed if you are seeking a tuition-free scholarship

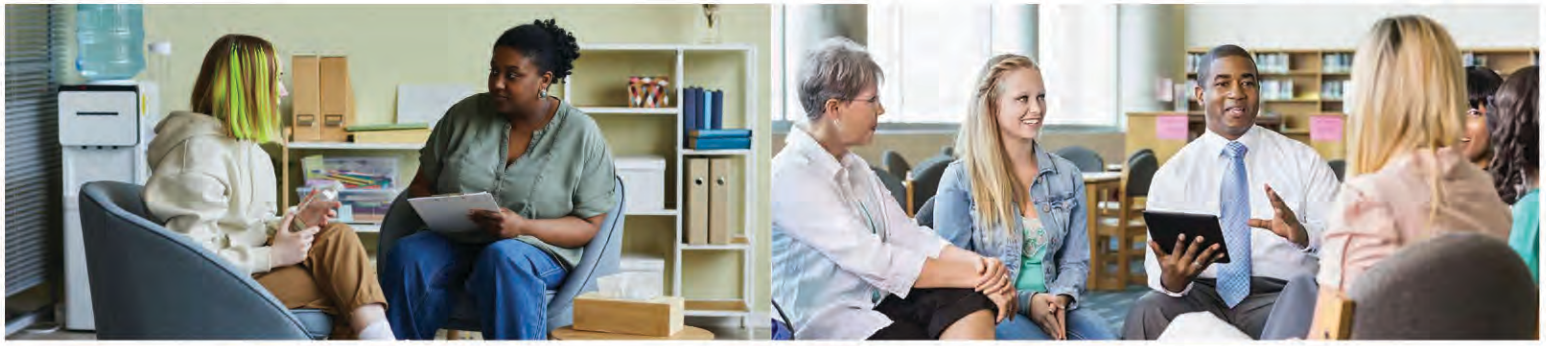
