1. **Minimum Wage Increase**

WHEREAS, THE HOURLY RATE OF PAY FOR NASSAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENT AIDES AND FEDERAL WORK STUDY EMPLOYEES IS \$8.75 PER HOUR FOR ON-CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT; AND

WHEREAS, THE FEDERAL MINIMUM WAGE IS \$7.25 PER HOUR EFFECTIVE JULY 24, 2009, PURSUANT TO THE FEDERAL MINIMUM WAGE PROVISIONS CONTAINED IN THE FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT (FLSA); AND

WHEREAS, STATES ALSO HAVE MINIMUM WAGE LAWS, WHERE SOME STATE LAWS PROVIDE GREATER EMPLOYEE PROTECTIONS; AND

WHEREAS, NY STATE MINIMUM WAGE INCREASED DECEMBER 31, 2015 FROM \$8.75 TO \$9.00; AND

WHEREAS, NY STATE MINUMUM WAGE WILL INCREASE ON DECEMBER 31, 2016 FROM \$9.00 TO \$10.00; AND

WHEREAS, EMPLOYERS MUST COMPLY WITH BOTH LAWS; AND

WHEREAS, A STUDENT MUST BE PAID AT LEAST THE FEDERAL MINIMUM WAGE UNDER THE FEDERAL WORK STUDY PROGRAM AS REQUIRED BY 34 CFR 675.24(B), AND UNDER 34 CFR 675.20(C), THE STUDENT'S WORK MUST ALSO BE GOVERNED BY

EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS INCLUDING PAY, THAT ARE APPROPRIATE IN TERMS OF, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE APPLICABLE FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL LAW; AND

WHEREAS, GOVERNMENT INSTITUTIONS ARE NOT SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE'S MINIMUM WAGE ACT, PURSUANT TO THE STATE REGULATION 12 NYCPR SECTION 142-2.14(B); AND

WHEREAS, NASSAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE IS COMMITTED TO PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES AT COMPETITIVE RATES TO NASSAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN THE FEDERAL WORK STUDY PROGRAM OR EMPLOYED AS STUDENT AIDS; AND

BE IT RESOLVED, THE NASSAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AUTHORIZES THE INCREASE IN THE HOURLY RATE OF PAY FOR NASSAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENT AIDES AND FEDERAL WORK STUDY EMPLOYEES FROM \$8.75 TO \$9.00 PER HOUR EFFECTIVE AUGUST 31, 2016, AND FROM \$9.00 TO \$10.00 EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 2016 FOR ON-CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT.

There is a large demand for Information Technologists, Computer Scientists, Software Computer Engineers and Law Enforcement to become trained in Cybersecurity. The Bureau of Labor Statistics cites a 36.5% increase in Information Security jobs over the next ten years. The Cybersecurity Certificate Program will introduce students to the work of information security. Confidentiality, integrity and availability will be a key focus as those three topics are a benchmark for evaluation of an information systems security. Students will be introduced to a wide variety of security related topics including physical security, encryption, security planning, disaster response, and will gain some hands-on understanding of various forensics tools.
