4. <u>Sabbaticals</u>

The Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) with the Nassau Community College Federation of Teachers (NCCFT) provides for ten (10) full-year at half-pay and fourteen (14) half-year at full-pay sabbatical leaves during the 2022/2023 academic year for full-time College faculty. The CBA imposes a number of conditions in order to be eligible for sabbatical leave, including at least six (6) years of consecutive service at the College.
