

Veterans must submit a copy of their Member 4 DD-214 to the **Admissions Office OR the Registrar's Office**. Timely submission of this document can ensure your successful enrollment.

REGISTRAR'S OFFICE

Application/Certification For Military and Veterans Educational Benefits

All evaluations of military credentials for college credit are done in the Registrar's Office. DANTES (Defense Activities for non-traditional education support, JST/Joint Services Transcript (formerly SMART), AART (Army/American Council on Education Registry Transcript) and all training will be considered for transfer credit.

The Certifying Officials will certify for veteran educational benefits. Veterans, or dependent children or spouse, must submit their Certificate of Eligibility (COE), NOBE or E Benefits page to one of the certifying officials. Once you have registered for classes, contact a certifying official to get your enrollment certified. The enrollment certification process must be repeated every term after registration for classes.

STUDENT HEALTH OFFICE

Be sure to submit **official** copies of your immunization records to this office. Veterans who show proof of honorable discharge on the DD-214 document, within 10 years of attendance of college, can be given an extension until the end of the semester. The military extension allows the veteran to obtain their immunization records from the military. They must complete the request form (180) and send to their branch of the military. Active military is not included.
