The health care industry on Long Island is one of the fastest growing sectors. Consider beginning your employment in this sector by training for one of the following entry-level positions. Over time, you can advance your career by earning additional credentials that will increase your earning power.



EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT – BASIC) – FOUR-MONTH COURSE!

Do you have an interest in helping others who are sick or injured? Do you want to make a difference and be an important part of an emergency team? This course is the first step on a pathway to a career as a paramedic or a variety of other careers in health care! In partnership with the Nassau County Emergency Medical Services Academy, NCC is offering an approved New York State Department of Health Emergency Medical Technician – Basic (EMT-B) course which will prepare students to become a certified EMT. An EMT is the basic level Emergency Medical Services (EMS) provider associated with an ambulance service or rescue squad.

During 132 hours of classroom training, including an American Heart Association (AHA) CPR certification, students will also complete 10 hours of ambulance or local hospital emergency room

rotations, as well as three online classes provided free of charge by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The textbook is required for the first day of class. Students should expect homework assignments and quizzes after each class. In order to successfully complete this intensive training course, students must have a sufficient ability to speak, read, and comprehend English. To qualify for the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) certifying exam, students must attend all classes, complete all assignments and quizzes, have a clear (no felonies) background check*, and pass the final written exam and practical skills exam. Students who pass the NYS exam will receive their Emergency Medical Technician certification from NYSDOH. Students must be 17 years of age by the written exam date. Content meets the requirement for the National Registry Exam. Textbook, exam fee, medical supplies and AHA CPR course are additional costs.

CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT – FOUR-MONTH COURSE!

Do you have a desire to join a profession focused on the care of individuals, families and communities? With a growing elderly population on Long Island, the long-term care industry is expanding and the demand for Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs) is increasing. In partnership with the VEEB Practical Nursing Program, NCC is offering a CNA program. Students will be taught patient care techniques such as personal grooming, feeding, transporting and administering treatments, as well as how to document patients' vital signs and symptoms. Course topics include: anatomy, physiology, nutrition, infection control, and legal and ethical policies. CNAs can work in a variety of settings including hospitals, nursing homes, adult day cares, private homes and assisted living facilities.

Students *must* complete the full 120 hours of training (90 classroom/lab hours and 30 clinical rotation hours) to sit for the New York State certifying exam. Clinical rotations will be conducted during designated Saturdays at a local nursing home; students must arrange their own transportation. Students must

be 18 years of age or older, have a high school diploma or equivalent, and meet vaccination (including Covid) and health screening requirements.

Textbooks, materials, make-up classes, and certifying exam are additional costs. Students will need to purchase blue scrubs and a stethoscope.

PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN

The Phlebotomy Technician is a vital member of the clinical laboratory team, whose main function is to obtain patient's blood specimens by venipuncture and microcollection for testing purposes. Offered in partnership with Condensed Curriculum International (CCI), the course will cover all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures for lab analysis. The course has 90 hours of instruction. The content includes: terminology; anatomy and physiology; blood collection procedures; specimen hands-on practice; and training in techniques to perform punctures. During the course, students will perform phlebotomy on a practice arm and then perform venipunctures on other students.

Textbook and supplies are included. Students are required to purchase blue scrubs. An optional, 40-hour Clinical Externship

is available after course completion. Students must comply with entry requirements, including a resume, background check*, drug screening, medical exam and provide proof of immunizations. Background check* and drug screening are additional related costs. Students who complete this program may pursue the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) Phlebotomy Technician Exam (or another certifying exam). Students must have a high school diploma or equivalent and a current government-issued photo ID. The cost of the exam is not included.

PHARMACY TECHNICIAN PROGRAM

Do you want to help others feel better and ensure that they have the necessary medication? This course will prepare students for the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) exam, www.ptcb.org/. Students will be taught pharmacology, drug classification, purpose, and interaction. Students will study how to interpret a prescription, calculate dosages, prevent medication errors, fill prescriptions, and inventory control. Also included is a review of the top 200 drugs, both generic and brand names. The course has 80 hours of instruction. Textbook is included. Students are required to purchase blue scrubs.

Entry requirements for the 80-hour Clinical Externship could include a resume, background check*, drug screening; a medical exam/proof of immunization. A government-provided photo ID is also required. Certifying exam is additional cost. CE1 254 B1 ON-CAMPUS COURSE Meets:

EKG TECHNICIAN

Do you have an interest in making a life-changing difference by helping people of all ages prevent and treat heart disease? If so, this comprehensive course will prepare students to sit for the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) certification exam and become a certified EKG (Electrocardiogram) Technician. Students will be introduced to the basic anatomy and physiology terminology associated with the heart and circulatory systems, signs and symptoms of diseases, and the electrophysiology/conduction system of the heart. Other topics that are covered include medical terminology, medical ethics, legal aspects of patient contact, and stress testing. Students will be taught to use and operate ECG equipment. Lab sessions will provide hands-on practice for proper lead placement, 12-lead placement and other clinical practices. Students will practice on other students in the class in order to meet the requirement for performing EKGs on live individuals. The course has 60 hours of instructor-led sessions in the classroom. Students must attend all classes and complete assignments,

including all practical skills. Entry requirements for the 30-hour Clinical Internship could include a resume, background check*, drug screening, and a medical exam/proof of immunization. A government-provided photo ID is also required.

To sit for the NHA certifying exam, candidates must meet the requirements specified by the NHA (https://www.nhanow.com/get-certified), including a high school diploma or equivalent and ten successful EKGs on a live individual. The course fee includes the textbook, scrubs, stethoscope and blood pressure cuff. The certifying exam cost is additional.

^{*}Applicants will be responsible to complete a background check. Once registered, a student will be provided information on completing the background check. Students are required to pay the cost of the background check. If you have been convicted of a felony, you should contact the Center for Workforce Development prior to registering for this program. A felony conviction may prevent you from participating in a clinical rotation or externship portion of the program. All cases will be reviewed on an individual basis. If it is determined that a student is not eligible to go into a clinical setting, the student may be allowed to continue with only the classroom portion of the program and may not meet requirements to sit for a certifying exam. The refund policy will be adhered to regardless of a student's eligibility for the clinical rotation/externship of any program.



MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID FOR ADULTS

Similar to traditional First Aid and CPR, Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is assistance provided to a person exhibiting a mental health problem or experiencing a crisis until professional treatment is obtained or the crisis resolves. People who enroll in local Mental Health First Aid courses will be taught a five-step action plan to help loved ones, colleagues, neighbors, and others cope with mental health or substance use problems. Mental Health First Aid is an evidence-based public education and prevention tool. It improves the public's knowledge of mental health and substance use problems and connects people with care for their mental health or substance use issues. This course is for ages 18 and over. Students who successfully complete the course will receive their Mental Health First Aid certification.

COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE



COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE

In partnership with Ancora Corporate Training, NCC is offering a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Class A training program. Students may be able to earn a CDL in as little as five weeks. CDL Class A Drivers transport goods between locations using tractor trailers and heavy trucks with a gross vehicle weight (GVW) capacity of more than 26,000 pounds. In order to pass a skills test to acquire a CDL, students must master performing a full vehicle inspection, range maneuvers, and proper operation of the vehicle on public roadways.

Job skills and qualifications for a CDL driver include:

- Valid Driver's License in New York State (NYS) and Resident of New York
- Be comfortable operating heavy machinery
- Ability to drive safely, regardless of weather or time of day
- Have strong eyesight and hearing, and be in good physical health
- Successfully pass a <u>DOT Physical</u> and <u>DOT Drug Test</u>
- Have a driving record that meets criteria
- 21 years of age or older
- Prove your legal presence/right to work in the United States and show Social Security card
- Sufficient ability to read and speak English
- Pass the CDL Permit Exam

As required by NYS, the student needs to attend all sessions, master all skills and knowledge in order to pass the road test. Study/homework is expected. The fee includes the use of materials in class, enrollment checks (driving record, drug test, and physical) and learner's permit study guide. Partial scholarships are available for eligible students. NCC will be offering a new full year with 144 hours of instructor-led training. Students must also complete an Apprenticeship. The first cohort is expected to start in January and continue through December 2024.

Topics include: health safety and nutrition, foundations of child development and theories; early education learning environments, curriculum and learning activities, child planning and assessment of learning, and early childhood professionals, communities and families.

The entry requirements include. interest in early education and human development related work, a high school diploma/GED, 18 years of age, ability to pass a background check with clearance to work with children and families, and a valid NYS driver's license. Supplies and books are included. At the end of the program, the student will qualify to take the Child Development Associate (CDA) certification exam.
