NASSAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications must be received by the last Friday of February. Applications are available through the Admissions Office for students who have never attended Nassau Community College or in Room E2225 for those who have previously attended NCC, or are currently attending NCC. (If you have attended another college after NCC, you must apply through the Admissions Office).

NEW APPLICANTS (with or without previous college credits): Apply through the Admissions Office.

Students with a High School Diploma

Grades of 75 or better is required in high school biology, chemistry and two years of mathematics. Regents' courses are required. (For New York State residents only).

Students who have never attended NCC, but have previous college credits or students who have attended another college after NCC: Must meet all of the requirements stated in the Programs and Admissions Requirements Chart available online or through the Admissions Office.

CURRENTLY ATTENDING NCC STUDENTS: Must request a transfer into the Program through the Department of Allied Health Sciences (Room E2225). Consideration for transfer into the PTA Program requires:

- Completion of at least 12 liberal arts credits from the Physical Therapist Assistant Program with an average of 2.5 or above. If chemistry was not completed in high school, a semester of introductory college chemistry is required, and may be counted as part of the "12 liberal arts credits".
- Grade of C+ or better in AHS 131 (Anatomy and Physiology I) and enrolled in or completion of AHS 132 is necessary to apply.
- If major is **Non Degree Seeking Student** you must submit all official transcripts from other colleges to NCC Office of Registrar to be evaluated for the Physical Therapist Assistant Program.

ALL APPLICANTS:

- **10 hours or more** of volunteer or paid work in a physical therapy setting documented on letterhead and signed by a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant. More than one letter may be submitted documenting any and all physical therapy experience.

Please be advised that to be employed in New York State, all graduate physical therapist assistants must pass a licensing examination and be certified by the state. Upon successful completion of the program, when you apply for certification as a Physical Therapist Assistant, you will be required to show evidence of your current name and any previous names you have used, any criminal records and your citizenship or legal status in the United States
